1. Company "A". The Company Headquarters remained at Khe Sanh (XD843418) with the 2nd and 3rd platoons. The 1st platoon remains in direct support of 3rd Marines at Camp Carroll (YD060541). Company "A" participated in Operation CROCKET from 1-16 July and Operation ARDMORE from 16-31 July. 1st platoon participated in Operation HICKORY II from 1-16 July.

In preparation for an anticipated artillery shoot at specific sights in vicinity (XD7134 and XD7135), an enemy infiltration route, three reconnaissance missions were made just west of Lang Vei (XD793361). A light section of Ontos, accompanying an armored column made recon inserts at (XD821454 and XD754356). Additionally, the company participated in patrols and mine sweeps on 2, 5, 6, 8, 9, 18, 19, 21, 24, 25 and 27 July 1967.

2. Company "B". During July, the Company CP (fwd) remained in direct support of 4th Marines at (YD532317) with CP (rear) at the Battalion CP in Gia Le. 1st platoon moved from support of 1st ARVN Division on 13 July and was replaced by 2nd platoon.

Operations include, CHOCIAW (1-9 July), FREEMONT (10-31 July) and CUMBERLAND (28-31 July). Additionally, 2nd platoon relieved 1st platoon in direct support of 1st Battalion, 3rd Regiment (14-20 July) and 3rd Battalion, 3rd Regiment (21-31 July), 1st ARVN Division at (YD691214).

On 6 July 1st platoon received an incoming grenade; no friendly casualties. Two VC were taken under fire by B-23 with one KIA (prob).

At 102230H July, 2nd platoon fired 39 HEPT rounds in support of Company "B", 3rd Battalion, 3rd Regiment, 1st ARVN Division. This action resulted in two VC KIA (conf), several captured automatic weapons and various maps and documents. During the night of 26 July, 2nd platoon accounted for 5 VC KIA (conf) by firing 38 HEPT rounds at (YD675235), a distance of about 3000 meters from the Ontos. The latter was a fire request from 1st Battalion, 3rd Regiment, 1st ARVN Division which had a patrol in that vicinity.

It was noted that the US Army Advisor with the 1st Battalion, 3rd Regiment, 1st ARVN Division is very satisfied with the added security to his position (YD691214) by 2nd platoon. He stated that his position would be untenable without the Ontos platoon there.

Three personnel of Company "B" were awarded Vietnamese Crosses of Gallantry by the Government of Viet Nam.

3. Company "C". During July Company "C" participated in Operations CIMA ARRON (4-2 July), BUFFALO (2-14 July), HICKORY II (14-16 July), KINGFISHER (16-31 July) and HIGH RISE (1-31 July).

The company continued in direct support of 9th Marines with the Company Headquarters and 1st platoon remaining at Dong Ha (YD231583), 2d Platoon at Gio Linh (YD215740), 3rd platoon at Cam Lo (YD140616) and 4th platoon at Con Thien (YD116701).

On 15 and 16 July 3rd platoon received incoming mortars damaging an antenna base, piercing two 106mm rifles and one Marine was medevaced.

On HICKORY II (14-16 July) 1st platoon showed the rough terrain maneuverability of the Ontos by breaking trail in extremely thick vegetation.

On 29 July 1st platoon participated in the portion of Operation KINGFISHER in the DMZ in support of 2nd Battalion, 9th Marines. Two Ontos were damaged, 2 ontos commanders and one driver were killed, and 11 platoon members were wounded in this eight hour fight. The ontos commanders were killed trying to break up the ambush. The Beehive round was used and several NVA were found with flechettes in their remains.

It appeared that the NVA were attempting to destroy the Ontos commander instead of the Ontos, as evidenced by the fact that 2 RPG's were fired high, at the commander rather than the vehicle itself. During the month the company received one R&E Ontos USMC 226675.

4. H&S Company. The company remained with the Battalion CP at (YD825153). The reaction platoon conducted thirty night and nine daylight patrols and ambushes as part of the local security effort. One cave was found and blown by 3d Engineer Battalion.

Bunkers and fields of fire for automatic weapons were improved. Work on the S-3 bunker continued while the laying of tangle foot wire was commenced on the northern portion of the perimeter.

The company continued to provide a thirty six man platoon with 1st Lt ~~AMES~~ and ~~Capt~~ ~~MOBLEY~~ as Platoon Commander and Platoon Sgt. respectively to 3rd ~~shore Party~~ Battalion for security of a Hydrographic Survey Party in the Colco Island (YD765345) and Huong Dien District (YD632427) areas. At 023014H July while at Huong Dien District Headquarters the platoon come under intensive mortar, small arms and ground attack by an estimated main force enemy battalion. Four enemy mortars were silenced by .50 caliber fire from the platoon. Checks of the mortar positions at first light revealed numerous blood pools, bloody rags and blood trails. Total enemy losses from ARVN and Marine fire were 2 KIA (Conf) and thirty eight KIA (prob).

H&S company provided, in addition, five Marines TAD to 2nd Battalion 26 Marines from 4-14 July, thirty-two Marines to 3rd Motor Transport Battalion for rough rider security on 21-22 July and nine man squad to 3rd Engineer Battalion for road building security in CUMBERLAND area.
