NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. Company "A". Company "A" participated in Operations Ardmore, Kingfisher and Liberty during the reporting period. Heavy rains have washed out sections of Highway #9 resulting in complete dependance on air for logistic support. Company "A"'s Ontos have been employed in a defensive role; all requests for fire support are approved by 26th Marines prior to the firing of the mission.
2. Company "B". Company "B" (-) remained in direct support of 4th Marines while 1st Platoon supported the 1st Bn. 3rd Regt., 1st ARVN Division. Company "B" (-) participated in Operations Freemont and Cumberland. On 14 September 2nd Platoon fired 21 rounds indirect fire into Coords YD678249, YD673235, YD670243 and YD676242 resulting in seven V.C. KIA (P). On 28 September, M50A1 B-21 was destroyed by an enemy explosive device, pressure detonated, during a stream fording operation in the vicinity of YD693215. The mine was estimated to be a 250 lb. device by combat engineers at the scene of the explosion. There were no serious injuries, however, nine personnel received minor wounds from flying objects.
3. Company "C". Company "C" remained in direct support of 9th Marines; and participated in Operations Kingfisher and Liberty. Throughout the reporting period elements occupied defensive positions at Con Thien, C-2, Cam Lo and Gio Linh. Operationally, the Ontos were used strictly in a defensive role. All firing was limited to indirect fire missions requested by the supported unit commander. Due to heavy rainfall, trafficability on roads is limited; while travel in areas without roads is nearly impossible. During the reporting period friendly personnel losses were one KIA and 10 WIA/NE; enemy personnel losses were one NVA KIA (Conf) and one NVA KIA (P). Friendly equipment losses were six M40A1C 106MM Recoiless Rifles due to artillery damage; enemy equipment losses were two 82MM mortars (P).
4. H&S Company. H&S Company remained at YD825153 during the month of September. The battalion security platoon conducted 28 night patrols/ambushes and 10 day patrols. In addition, listening posts were utilized on six occasions. Personnel participating in night patrols and listening posts reported four separate sightings of small groups, 2-4 persons, moving within 3rd Antitanks TACR forward of the defensive wire. The sightings did not result in physical contact due to distance involved. One squad of the battalion security platoon is OPCON 4th Marines in order to provide security for elements of MCB-3 working on National Road #1 between the Song Bo river and the city of Hue. During the reporting period, extensive effort was devoted to improving the defensive bunkers and defensive wire network.

5. a. On 6 September, Corporal Clinton B. SCOTT, 2190466/0353 USMC was wounded by a sniper fire from the vicinity of YD 692312. His wound was not serious, but he was still MedEvaced to Company "A", 3d Medical Battalion at Phu Hai, and was subsequently evacuated out of country.

b. About 1130 on 28 Sep 1967, Otter B-21 was destroyed by an enemy explosive device, pressure detonated, during a stream fording operation in the vicinity of YD 692315. Size of the mine was approximately 250 lbs. as determined by engineers at the scene. There were no serious injuries, but nine persons received minor wounds from flying objects.

e. On 1 Sep 1967, 2nd Platoon fired a total of 33 rounds indirect fire into Coord YD 650233, 657240, 678235, 680227, 682232, 686220, and 690219 with unknown results. On 3 September, 89 rounds were fired as indirect fire into Coord YD 665235, 667223, 667247, 667229, 665246, 667223, 672222, 684232, 680929, 677225, 678227, 674225, with unknown results. On 5 September, 3rd Platoon fired a total of 33 rounds indirect fire into Coord 738152. On 14 September 1967 2nd Platoon fired a total of 21 rounds indirect fire into Coord YD 676249, 673235, 670243, 676242 with seven (?) V. C. KIA probable. On 20 Sept, 1st Platoon fired a total of 12 rounds indirect fire into Coord 650235, 657237, and 665232 with results unknown. On 25 Sept, a total of 21 rounds were fired as indirect fire into Coord YD 670240, 665240, 673235, 663238, 673243 with unknown results.

a. During September, this company participated in Operations Kingfisher (1-30Sep) and Liberty (1-4Sep). Throughout the reporting period, elements occupied defensive positions at Con Thien, C-2, Cam Lo and Gio Linh.

c. During the reporting period, the Ontos have been used on defensive positions. Utilization was limited to indirect fire missions. Trafficability on roads varied from good to impassable depending on the weather. Due to rain, travel in areas not having roads is severely limited. Heavy rains have created obstacles as follows:

(1) Route 1 - YD219636 - bridge blown on or about 3Sep67 has bypass which is inundated during heavy rain. Other portions of Route 1 between Dong Ha and Gio Linh become inundated, but are passable.

(2) Route 561 - Cam Lo Bridge - YD147604. High waters closed bridge to all traffic on two occasions.

(3) New Route 561 between C-2 and Con Thien - Wash out at YD128675 precludes all vehicular movement. Trafficability north of the wash out is unsatisfactory for all vehicles during, and subsequent to heavy rains. Attempts are being made by Engineer units to improve this road, and bridge wash.

1. In accordance with reference (a), the Command Chronology for this unit for the month of September 1967 is submitted.

a. Physical Security of the Battalion Command Post. During the month the Reaction Platoon conducted 28 night patrols and 10 day patrols. In addition, all night listening posts were set in forward of the perimeter on 6 occasions. There was no contact and no casualties. One squad from the platoon continued OpCon to 4th Marines providing security for elements of MCB-3 between the An Lo Bridge and the city of Hue. The squad CP remained at PK-17 (YD 645285). On 20 September one man was MIANE when the truck from MCB-3 on which he was riding detonated a mine at (YD 658276) and was destroyed.

b. Command Post Defense. On 8 occasions, all night 100% alert was ordered by the Base Coordinator upon receipt of intelligence indicating increased possibility of mortar and/or ground attack during the month. As a result, work on the CP was slowed. Nevertheless, Bunker # 4 was completed, Bunker # 5 was begun and 80% completed, and Bunker # 1 was begun and 60% completed. New gates were constructed for the perimeter and repairs to the barbed wire made to permit the gates to fit properly into the wire.

The tunnel leading from the CO's quarters to the COC Bunker was removed and a second laddered entrance installed.

Provisions were made to place two ground-mounted 106mm rifles on the perimeter when an operable Ontos was not available in the CP.

Burning and cutting of brush was undertaken in stream beds and draws. Tanglefoot wire was installed in these avenues of approach as well as in graves within the perimeter to prevent their use by the enemy in the event of ground attack.

The use of fougasses was begun with three experimental fougasses consisting of 55 gallons of gasoline backed by a shaped charge. Installation in permanent positions awaits completion of burning and brush cutting.

The two ammunition bunkers were grounded and surrounded by a three-strand fence with zig-zag entrance.

c. Training. Eight Marines received initial in-country indoctrination. Fan Firing was conducted as follows:
