JUNE 1966 SUMMARY
PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

The Battalion's personnel posture in relation to the strength authorized by the "series T/O is rapidly becoming unacceptable. As of 30 June the Chargeable strength was 35 Marine Officers and 554 Marine Enlisted compared to a T/O of 41 officers and 606 enlisted. Without replacements the Battalion will be unable to man 5 tanks by the end of July. This is one tank platoon or the tank support for one infantry battalion which will not be available to the division.

The Battalion joined 1 USMC officer and 20 USMC enlisted during June. The Battalion transferred 19 enlisted Marines to security type duty this month. This is a total of 63 during the last two months who have been transferred to security duty. Nearly all of these personnel were school trained, mechanics, radio operators, radio technicians, etc. These losses have deprived the Battalion of experienced support personnel and has an adverse effect on our ability to perform combat missions. This situation has been brought to the attention of the Commanding General and his staff.

Current T/O shortages are: 1 Sergeant 0121, 1 Sergeant 0231, 1 Sergeant 0431, 1 Gunnery Sergeant 0441, 1 Corporal 1316, 1 Lance Corporal 1441, 17 1811's, 2 Lance Corporal 2111, 13 2141's, 1 Master Gunnery Sergeant 2192, 2 PFC 2311, 6 2531's, 2 2841's, 2 3371's, 1 3516, 9 3531, 5 5591. Of these shortages the 1811's, 2141's, 2531's, and 3531's are the most critical and affect the Battalion's ability to perform its combat mission. These personnel shortages are further intensified by the Battalion's rear area security commitments. Three infantry squads are committed to III MAF for security; thus, there is a loss of another 42 support personnel from the Headquarters and Service Company. Counting personnel shortages and committed personnel, H&S Company has an effective on hand strength of 163 or 64% of its T/O.

Three breaches of discipline have occurred which resulted in one Special and two Summary Courts-Martial.

Morale continues to be excellent but personnel shortages are having their effect. Swim call at China Beach is almost impossible to conduct and little opportunity is available for personnel to take a break in their daily routine. R&R is the major factor in building morale and is looked forward to by all hands.

The Battalion continues to have excellent results on extensions of overseas tours. 13 requests were processed during June, bringing the total since arrival in RVN to 100. If leave is CONUS is made available many more extensions will result.

During the month of June the 3d Tank Battalion experienced relatively the same employment of anti-tank tactics which has prevailed for the past eleven months except for the following changes:

(1) In one instance an anti-tank mine was detonated that was also covered by heavy enemy small arms fire inflicting casualties to infantry security elements.

(2) During Operation Liberty, tank support to infantry elements was increased. While in this role tanks were directly fired upon by enemy small arms in more than twenty (20) instances.

(3) Also during Operation Liberty, on two separate occasions rifle grenades were fired directly at tanks.

The M48A3 tanks of the 3d Tank Battalion have encountered a total of thirty-one (31) anti-tank mines from June 1965 through June 1966.

The following is a chronological listing of anti-tank mining incidents during the month of June 1966.

(1) On 1 June a tank detonated a mine northwest of Phu-Bai at coordinates (YD 502271). The mine consisted of seventy-five (75) pounds of TNT and was detonated by a pressure-type device. This mine was covered by a heavy volume of sniper fire. Damage to the tank was light. Four (4) Marine infantrymen were WIA in this incident.

(2) On 2 June a tank detonated an anti-tank mine south of DaNang at coordinates (BT 062625). The mine was described as either a 105 MM or 155 MM artillery round. It was detonated by a pressure-type device. The tank incurred extensive damage. There were no casualties.

(3) On 26 June a tank detonated a mine south of DaNang at coordinates (AT 950591). The mine was described as an 81 MM mortar round. It was detonated by a trip wire device. Damage to the tank was light. No Marine casualties were incurred.

(4) On 30 June a tank detonated a mine south of DaNang at coordinates (BT 122627). The mine was of an unknown type and size. Damage to the tank was light. No Marine casualties were incurred.

One incident occurred involving a wheeled vehicle:

On 22 June a Tank Battalion jeep detonated a mine north of DaNang at coordinates (AT 935825). The mine was of an unknown type and size. The jeep incurred extensive damage. One (1) Marine was slightly wounded.

Because of the M48A3's invulnerability to anti-personnel mines the 3d Tank Battalion has participated in mine sweeps which have netted the destruction of an excess of an excess of thirty (30) anti-personnel mines. The procedure involved during these sweeps has been to maneuver the tank through a suspected mine field and/or to fire 90 MM H.E. or Cannister which cause secondary explosions. Both measures have been proven successful and beneficial.

In conclusion it should be pointed out that the enemy is assuming a more aggressive role against tanks. Considering the continuous mining incidents and the increase of small arms attacks the 3d Tank Battalion can expect a more conventional and aggressive tactic to immobilize the overwhelming fire power and mobility of the tank.

OPERATIONS

During June 1966 the 3d Tank Battalion continued to support the division in the Da Nang and Phu Bai TAOR's. On 20 June 1966 the 3d Tank Battalion was once again reinforced when it assumed operational control of Company "C" (-) 1st Tank Battalion.

Tank action during June has been decidedly more intense than any previous month. The tanks were involved in significantly more combat operations, engaged more enemy targets and made their presence felt by the enemy more than in past months. Tank support this month has been a major factor in the division successfully achieving domination of the greater portion of the Song Thu Ban/Song Ky Lam River south of the Da Nang TAOR-an area long dominated by the Viet Cong.

The primary effort of the Tank Battalion this month was devoted to support of Operation Liberty in the Da Nang TAOR. (See special report of Operation Liberty).

Tank Operations this month accounted for 61 VC KIA (CONF), 23 VC KIA (PROB), and 4 VC WIA. Forty-eight buildings were destroyed along with 45 boats, 9600 meters of trenchline, 5 VC bunkers, 8 fighting holes, 3 automatic weapons pits, 2 tank traps and 1 anti personnel minefield comprised of 18 mines. (Tanks have also detonated in excess of 12 additional AP mines this month refer to Special operations on counter mine activities).

Ammunition expended this month totaled 1381 rounds of 90mm, 6715 rounds of 50 caliber, and 22,825 rounds of 30 caliber. Of this amount, the following was expended while in support of Operation Liberty: 611 rounds of 90mm, 445 rounds of 50 caliber, and 15,445 rounds of 30 caliber. Seven H&I fire missions accounted for 232 rounds of the above total of expended 90mm rounds. Flame tanks were utilized for seven burning missions.

OPERATION LIBERTY

The mission of Operation Liberty was to clear the southern portion of the Da Nang TAOR of VC forces. Assignments of tank battalion units on this operation were as follows:

Company "B" commenced the operation with the 1st and 2nd platoons in support of 1/1, the 3rd platoon in support of 2/9 and assumed OPCON of the 3rd platoon of Company "A" which was in support of 1/9. On 20 June Company "B" assumed OPCON of one section of 1st platoon Company "C", 1st Tank Battalion (OPCON of 3rd Tank Battalion). This section was put in support of 2/9. Also on this date 1st platoon Company "B" that had been in support of 1/1 was replaced by the 3rd platoon of Company "C" (-), 1st Tank Battalion. This Company "B" platoon then was committed in support of 1/9.

~~CONFIDENTIAL~~ The Tank Battalion operations of the month of June, exclusive of operations of the month of June, are as follows:

Company "A" (-) (Rein) continued to occupy key positions in the 3d Marine Regiment TAOR.

6 June: Two 1st platoon tanks supported Company "K", 3/9 in a sweep of area in grid squares (AT 9966 and 9562). There was no enemy contact.

8 June: While in a night position with Company "A" 1/9 a third platoon tank using its infra-red tank mounted searchlight observed a VC in the road at (AT 979623). The VC appeared to be preparing to set a mine. Tank caliber 30 machine gun fire was directed on him and he fled into nearby treeline.

While in support of Company "A", 1/9, a Company "A" headquarters dozer tank destroyed and filled approximately 9000 meters of trenchline in grid squares (AT 9562, 9563, 9564, 9664, 9764).

15 June: Two Company headquarters tanks operating with elements of 2/9 discovered two camouflaged tank traps each 10' X 10' X 15' at (AT 948268) and (AT 949632). The bulldozer tank covered both traps.

19 June: A 2d platoon tank while in support of elements of 1/3 located at Nam O Bridge (AT 928828), received 12-15 rounds of mortar fire. The tanks returned caliber 30 and caliber 50 machine gun fire upon the suspected mortar positions. The tanks then supported an infantry search of the area. Search resulted in 2 VC KIA (PROB) and 2 VC WIA. Three 60 MM mortar rounds and 1 60 MM mortar sight were recovered.

29 June: Two 1st platoon tanks while in support of elements of 2/3 located at (AT 899579) sank a boat at (AT 878565). Tank 90 MM fire was delivered on target with good effect. Estimate 1 VC KIA (PROB) and 1 VC WIA (PROB) as a result of this action.

There were two additional incidents of Company "A" tanks receiving small arms fire during the month. In both instances tanks returned fire with unknown results.

COMPANY "B"

2 June: A 2d platoon tank observed and took under fire, 3 VC located at (AT 055629). Tank 90 MM fire resulted in 3 VC KIA (CONF).

Flame tanks from headquarters platoon were utilized by 2/9 in two fire missions to destroy enemy fortifications and possible ambush sites.

A company headquarters tank acting as security for flame tanks working with Company "F", 2/9, observed 4 VC running into a house at (BT 078619). 90 MM and 50 caliber fire demolished the house with resulting 4 VC KIA (PROB).

The 1st platoon of Company "A" was in support of 2/3 for the duration of Operation Liberty.

Tank Operation during Operation Liberty (as depicted on the Operation Liberty overlay and the 1/1 operation overlay) were conducted in support of infantry units sweeping southward through their TAOR'S to assigned objectives bordering the north banks of the Song Thu Ban/Son Ky Lam waterway. Tanks provided combat support for their respective infantry units for the entirety of the operation. In the 2/9 TAOR the infantry and tank advance was blocked by the Song Ai Nghia river at (AT 990642). At this point the tanks supporting 2/9 were transferred to support operations in the 1/9 TAOR. These tanks advanced southward with elements of 1/ crossed the river at (AT 968607) and then moved back into the 2/9 TAOR to resume operations with 2/9 in the movement to their objective.

The following is a chronological sequence of events occurring on Operation Liberty:

COMPANY "B" (REIN)

11 June: 1st platoon supported Company "D", 1/1 in a sweep of the area at (BT 096635). Tanks destroyed one booby trap with 90mm fire. Two hundred feet of trenchline and 3 circular automatic weapons pits were also destroyed by the tanks.

14 June: A 3d platoon Company "A" tank OPCON to Company "B" observed 6 VC in treeline at (AT 947569) and fired 90mm at the enemy. A search of the area resulted in 3 VC KIA (CONF).

15 June: 3d platoon Company "A" OPCON to Company "B" and supporting Co. "B" 1/9 fired 90mm at suspected VC positions in village at (AT 927564) and destroyed same.

16 June: A 3d platoon tank while supporting elements of 2/9 observed 9 VC in the river at (BT 974565) and two VC with weapons on the north bank of the river. Tanks fired 90mm and observed bodies falling but the probable casualties could not be confirmed as no search was conducted due to inaccessibility of the area.

Two 2nd platoon tanks supporting Company "G" 2/9 destroyed 7 houses, 8 fighting holes and detonated 1 AP mine at (AT 005621). Three 2nd platoon tanks supporting Company "B" 1/1 located at (BT 078608) received 400 rounds of small arms fire and approximately 8 grenades from an estimated VC platoon. The tanks returned 90mm and 30 caliber fire. The results of this action were unknown as darkness precluded a search.

In this same vicinity a tank detonated an M-26 booby trapped grenade with no resulting casualties.

17 June: A 3rd platoon tank in support of 1/9 at (AT 9713567) observed 9 VC carrying weapons and entering the river. The tank fired 90mm into the enemy and the 3 VC appeared to be hit. Area was not searched as VC were south of the Song Thu Ban River. 3 VC KIA (PROB).

18 June: A headquarters flame tank in support of Company "B" 1/1 at (BT 080608) burned VC tunnels located in that area.

Two Company "A" tanks OPCON to Company "B" while in support of 1/9 at (AT 925550) received small arms fire and two rifle grenades. One rifle grenade hit one of the tanks but did not detonate. Tanks returned 90mm cannister fire and 30 caliber fire. The results of this action were one VC KIA (CONF) and one VC WIA (CONF).

Two Company "A" tanks OPCON to Company "B" and in support of 1/9 located at (AT 915557) received 15 rounds of mortar fire. Tanks returned 90mm fire at the suspected mortar sites. The mortar fire ceased. Five infantrymen were wounded by the mortar fire.

A 3rd platoon tank in support of 1/9 at (AT 959555) observed with the tank mounted infra-red searchlight, 3 VC in a boat and 4 VC on the bank of the river. The tank switched to white light and fired 90mm, caliber 50, and caliber 30, upon the enemy. The boat was sunk and a search of the area resulted in 4 VC KIA (CONF). A personal search of the sunken boat conducted by the tank platoon commander on the following morning, the following items were found: thirty-five 100 pounds bags of rice, 45 gallons of kerosene, personal letters, assorted documents, Russian bandages and medical supplies and a wallet with 200 piasters.

19 June: Two 1st platoon tanks while in support of 1/1 located (BT 131625) engaged in a fire fight with VC located at (BT 1346). Tanks fired caliber 30 and a later search of the area disclosed VC WIA.

Two 1st platoon tanks in support of Company "D" 1/1 located at (BT 116629) engaged an undetermined number of VC at (BT 1216). The tanks fired 90mm upon the enemy. Results of this action were 1 VC WIA.

21 June: A tank from the 1st platoon while in support of element of 1/1 located at (BT 126332) received 30 rounds of mortar fire from (BT 130628). The tank fired 90mm. Results were unknown as darkness precluded search.

Two 1st platoon tanks while in support of Company "B", 1/9 located at (BT 925535) received small arms fire from (AT 925528). Tanks returned fire with 90mm. The tank fire destroyed 6 boats and 4 houses. The results were unknown as an intervening river precluded search.

Two 1st platoon tanks while in support of Company "B", 1/9 located at (AT 925534) received small arms fire from (AT 923526). The tanks returned 90mm fire and results were 1 VC KIA (CONF).

22 June: 1st platoon tanks while in support of Company "D", 1/9 observed VC at (AT 947543). The tanks fired 90mm and caliber 30 and observed direct hit on 3 VC. 3 VC KIA (CONF) were the results of this action.

23 June: Two 1st platoon tanks while in support of Company "D", 1/9 observed and fired 90mm and caliber 30 at (AT 947543). Direct hits on the enemy were observed by the infantry commander, however, the area was not searched as the Song Thu Ban River intervened.

24 June: 2nd platoon tanks located at (AT 957562) fired 90mm on 4 VC located at (BT 947536). Results of this action were 2 VC KIA (PROB).

25 June: Two 2nd platoon tanks while in support of Company "D", 1/9 fired 90mm into 6 sampans located at (AT 947544). VC casualties were unknown as the river made a search impossible. Six boats were sunk by the tank fire.

A company headquarters tank in support of Company "B", 1/9 located at (AT 925529) received small arms fire from a house at (AT 925529). The tank returned fire with 90mm and destroyed the house. A search of the area disclosed 1 VC KIA (CONF).

25-28 June: During this period Company "B" and Company "C", 1st Tank Battalion, tanks (OPCON to 3d Tank Bn) conducted a small operation in support of 1/1. (Refer to 1/1 operation overlay) 15 gun tanks, two flame tanks and one retriever were placed in direct support of the 1/1 which was advancing from Phase Line Amber to Phase Line Green. Personnel from Company "B" were placed in a advisory capacity to the operating sections of Company "C" 1st Tank Battalion, as the former had been operating in the area for 11 months and knew it well while Company "C" was relatively new to the area.

The vehicles were staged according to plan on the afternoon of 22 June at the LOD (Phase Line Amber). Assignments of tanks were made placing 3d platoon Company "C" 1st Tank Battalion and 1 platoon Company "B" 3d Tank Battalion in direct support of 1/1. Four tanks were committed on Axis Yellow and the remaining three tanks were committed to Axis Blue. Three tanks from the 2d platoon Company "C", 1st Tank Battalion were assigned to Axis Red. Three tanks from the 1st platoon were placed in direct support of Company "C", 1/1, on Axis Brown. The headquarters tanks and the retriever and two flame tanks from Company "B" 3d Tank Battalion were held in reserve and provided security for the command group of 1/1 which was mounted in two LVT's. Although originally scheduled to begin on the 23rd of June, the operation was postponed for a period of 48 hours.

Tanks expended 90mm, 50 caliber, and 30 caliber on the VC. Result of this action were 5 VC KIA (CONF) and 7 VC KIA (PROB). A total of 12 boats were also destroyed.

29 June: Two 3rd platoon tanks in support of Company "C", 1/9 located at (AT 902547) fired 90mm into a VC village. Village was searched by infantry with negative results.

30 June: A 2nd platoon tank while in support of Company "B" 1/9 fired at a sniper located at (AT 925529). The tank was then fired on by 57mm recoilless rifle but not hit. The tank returned fire with 90mm and 30 caliber. An air observer in the vicinity credited the tank with 4 VC KIA (CONF). This same tank observed boats landing VC at (AT 912556 and 911531). The tank fired 90mm and sank 2 boats and damaged 10 mord. A search of the area revealed 15 VC KIA (CONF).

During the month of June, Company "B" tanks received small arms fire in an additional 31 incidents. In all these VC incidents the tanks returned fire with unknown results as a search was not made due to inaccessability of the terrain, pressing operational committments, or darkness.

COMPANY "C" 1st TANK BATTALION

Company "C", 1st Tank Battalion arrived in Da Nang on 19 June. This company was put under the operational control of 3rd Tank Battalion and committed in direct support of 1/1 on 20 June. All tank operations were conducted in support of Operation Liberty.

22 June: Two 1st platoon tanks participated in sweep in vicinity (BT 000630 to 013635) with elements of 2nd Battalion, 9th Marines. The tanks destroyed 15 houses and 3 bunkers.

24 June: 3rd platoon tanks while in support of 1/1 located at (BT 105647) engaged enemy of unknown force. Four tanks fired 90mm and 30 caliber with unknown results as darkness precluded search.

26 June: Two 1st platoon tanks while in support of elements of 2/9 located a minefield at (BT 007610). Tanks fired 90mm into mines and noted 18 secondary explosions.

27 June: Two 1st platoon tanks supported elements of 2/9 on a sweep in the vicinity of (BT 009613). Tanks destroyed 2 buildings and one bunker with 90mm fire.

28 June: Four tanks supported Company "B" 1/1 in a sweep conduct in the vicinity of (BT 079613). Two VCS were captured during this search.

On the 25th the operation commenced. The infantry pushed off from Phase Line Amber with the tanks in direct support. Company "B" 1/1 advanced down Axis Red sweeping south through the large paddy area below Pheng Ho #2, across highway 14 and down into Trein Tu #3. Three tanks from 2nd platoon Company "B" 3rd Tank Battalion were able to accompany the infantry throughout the operation. Although the paddies were all under water, the paddy bed was firm clay which allowed the tanks to traverse the area with ease. Company "C" 1/1 with tanks advanced along Axis Brown. This large sand flat running directly down the middle of the 1/1 TAOR from Tra Khe #3 south to Highway 14 affords tanks the maximum use of cross country mobility. Company "A" advanced from Ha Quang #3 at the base of the horseshoe lake area on two axes down to the Hoi An City Limits. No contact was made with the VC during the operation.

HIGHLIGHTS

On the second day of the operation Company "A" 1/1 was directed to take the large island in the center of the Song De Vang River just north of San Pho #1 at (BT 155605). The island was reportedly well fortified and defended. Initially it was felt by the infantry commander that tanks could not lend any appreciable support due to the nature of the terrain in the area. It was therefore decided to have the 3rd platoon Company "B" tanks support the infantry crossing by fire. Upon arrival at the objective it was determined by the tank officer, after a thorough reconnaissance, that tanks could accompany the infantry to the island provided the dike area at the north end of the island was sufficiently improved to allow a passage of tanks. The dozer tank was immediately put to work dozing earth into the river. After 30 minutes of dozer work the gap was bridged and the first tank rolled across to support the infantry. The island was fortified, however no contact was made as the fortifications were not defended. No other tanks were sent across since no contact was made. However, the dozer tank was assigned the task of reducing the VC bunkers, trenchlines, punji pits and spike fields on the island.

On the third day of the operation the tank officer with the headquarters tank section conducted a reconnaissance west along highway 14 from Noi An to the Dein Ban district Headquarters then south down Highway 1 to the Song Cau Mong and advanced eastward along the secondary road which skirts the Song Cau Mong and rejoined Highway 14. All the bridges along the route were sufficient for tanks. In addition two fording sites were reconnoitered across the Song Cau Mong to the island at Treim Nam. The presence of Marine tanks in this area gave a tremendous boost to the morale of the hard pressed Vietnamese troops. It was the first time that Marine tanks had been in this portion of the TAOR.

27 June: Two 3rd platoon tanks, while on a combat patrol with elements of 1/9 located in the vicinity of grid square (AT 9153) fired at 12 VC located at (AT 916536) and 3 VC located at (AT 902538).

While in a nighttime position at Company "B" headquarters, a tank observed 2 VC running immediately outside the company perimeter at (BT 065117). The VC were observed by the infra-red light and fired upon with a 30 caliber machine gun. One fell as if hit. The other dropped to the ground and then both disappeared into the nearby village at (BT 065717).

5 June: Three 2d platoon tanks with a platoon of 1/1 came to the assistance of the 1/1 Command Group who were receiving heavy fire at (BT 072622). Upon arriving at the scene the tanks learned that the enemy had broken contact. Enroute back to 1/1 CP, tanks and infantry were taken under fire by an estimated 30-40 VC. Tanks and infantry returned fire resulting in 3 VC KIA credited to tanks and 3 VC KIA credited to infantry. Two VC were captured and sent to 1/1 CP.

7 June: 2d platoon tanks while working with elements of Company "B" 1/1 observed and fired 90 MM at 3 VC in river at (BT 099644). 2 VC sank in water and one VC WIA was found on the river bank. 2 VC KIA (PROB).

COMPANY "C"

Company "C" continued to provide tank combat support for infantry units operating in the Phu Bai TAOR.

4 June: Two 2d platoon tanks supported Company "G", 2/1 in a sweep of the area in vicinity of (YD 526287). An estimated 2600 pounds of rice was discovered and turned over to the logistics support unit. Forty civilians were escorted out of the village of Ap Co Xuan.

6 June: Seven gun tanks and one flame tank supported Company "E" 2/1 on a search and destroy mission along the Song Bo River at (YD 574276).

7 June: Seven gun tanks and 1 flame tank supported Company "H", 2/1 by delivering 90 MM gun fire into probable VC locations on the ridge line in grid squares (YD 4825 and 4925). The tanks fired into suspected VC fortifications in the village of Lou Hoc Hein (YD 4727). The flame tank fired upon the same village. En route back to Company "H" CP (YD 520300) the tanks, with infantry mounted, received 3 rounds of 81 MM mortar fire. The tanks returned 90 MM and caliber 30 fire into the suspected mortar site. No casualties were received by the Marines.

9-11 June: The 2d and 3d platoons supported 2/4 and 2/1 respectively, for the first two days of Operation Florida.

12 June: Five tanks supporting the 5th and 7th Vietnamese Airborne Battalions fired 90 MM into the village of Thanh Thanh at (YD 560240 and 570240) (Refer to Company "C" in support of VN Airborne Brigade Overlay). Tanks fired from positions as shown

on overlay into sectors A, B, & C in conjunction with the sweep of that area by the ARVN units. These missions were called by a tank liason team working directly with the Vietnamese units.

12 June: 3 tanks supported 2/1 and fired 90 MM at VC command posts and observation posts in grid squares (YD 4625, 4725, 4824, 4825).

14 June: Company "C" moved back to the 4th Marines TAOR. En-route tanks encountered many altars placed in the middle of the roads by demonstrating Buddhists. The altars caused some delay in the progress of the tanks. Approximately 375 altars were removed by the Vietnamese special police in order that the tanks could get through.

In Hue, at 0500 on the 15th of June, Buddhists demonstrated around tank positions. The demonstration was short lived and tanks departed Hue and arrived without incident at destination at 0720.

22 June: The 1st platoon supported 1/4 on a search and destroy mission in the vicinity of (YD 860350). The tanks fired preparatory fires of 90 MM into the area prior to the infantry search

During the month of June the 3d Tank Battalion embarked upon a more extensive program of countering the mine incidents initiated by the enemy.

The numerous incidents of tanks detonating, and being damaged by, anti-tank mines and the projected continuation of these occurrences in the future has necessitated the Tank Battalion putting added emphasis in the realm of mine detection and removal. To date, the 3d Tank Battalion has had a total of 31 major anti-tank mine incidents since arrival in Vietnam.

It has been found that reconnaissance by fire by the tanks of suspected areas has proven successful in clearing mines. Throughout the month of June tanks have on many occasions directed 50 and 30 caliber machine gun and 90 MM fire into suspected mined areas and such tank fire resulted in secondary explosions. Of the 90 MM rounds, the canister round has been the most effective for this purpose. It is felt the reason for this is due to the dispersion pattern of the round. This method is predominately employed only in those locations that the terrain has canalized the movement of tanks. These are the areas most likely to be mined.

Additional methods have been conceived and are in the process of being tested. One, for example, is a heavy wagon-type device mounted on tank road wheels. This construction is pulled or pushed by the tank and its purpose is to detonate those mines it traverses upon. This has been used by our units on two occasions. No mines have been encountered while using it and it has, due to its rigidity, "fallen apart at the seams" so to speak.

Another device used by this command consists of a section of tank track blocks which are dragged behind the tank by cables. The weight of the blocks is sufficient to set off any mines in its path. The practicability of this method was limited as the blocks would become entangled with roots, logs and other such obstacles causing the device to break away from the towing cables.

The tank has been very effective in clearing areas of operation of anti-personnel mines for the infantry. The tanks traverse suspected areas and detonate the mines. These AP mines cause no damage to tanks. This has been utilized in both TAORS, and most extensively to date in the 1/9 area of the DaNang TAOR. It has been found that the VC mine areas according to the type traffic they expect. They have not mixed AP mines with AT mines to date.

In the 2/9 TAOR tanks have on several occasions followed mine sweeping teams (some 100 meters back) and in turn are followed (same distance) by unarmored vehicles, many carrying troops.

The tanks act as a buffer. If the sweep team misses a mine the tank will most likely set it off, thereby giving an added protection to the vehicles and troops following. The tank may suffer damage but nothing compared to an unarmored vehicle and the troops riding in it.

The tanks have set off several AP mines in these operations and once noted a VC mine marking (crossed bamboo stakes) fired into it and produced 3 secondary explosions. It has been learned that not even traversing over a mine the first time is a positive method of finding and detonating mines. During June, a water truck following in the trace of a tank detonated a mine, receiving considerable damage. Subsequent investigation of the tank's tracks revealed that the tank had traversed the same mine. It is possible that the rudimentary nature of some VC mines requires that more than one traverse is necessary to break down the wedges that separate the contact points. It may take 4 or 5 passes to detonate the mine, or it may detonate on the first pass.

TRAINING

During the month of June 3rd Tank Battalion continued to conduct between operational commitments training in troop orientation and indoctrination required by current directives for individuals and units.

Familiarization firing was conducted on the cal..50 M.G. M-14 Rifle and cal. .45 Pistol for Tank Maintenance Platoon personnel on 11 June at the Hoa Cam Training Center Range.

On 19 June Company "C", 1st Tank Battalion was placed under operational control of 3rd Tank Battalion. Prior to deploying the company in a direct support mission all hands were thoroughly indoctrinated in Division and local level SOP's for operations and conduct of personnel within the division TAOR. Particular emphasis was placed on lesson learned in mine detection and clearance techniques.

(5) An accelerated and closely supervised resupply of tank units involved in Operation Liberty.

(6) Continued development of the cantonment.

The 1st and 3rd platoons of Company "B" and the 3rd platoon of Company "A" (OPCON to Company "B") are currently in direct support of the 9th Marine Regiment. The 2nd platoon of Company "B" remains in direct support of 1st Marines and became OPCON to Company "C", 1st Tank Battalion, on 20 June 1966.

Company "C" (Rein) operating in the Hue/Phy Bai area, remains in direct support of the 4th Marine Regiment.

Company "C" (-) (Rein), 1st Tank Battalion, was assigned on 20 June 1966, to direct support of the 1st Marine Regiment. One section of the 1st platoon became OPCON to Company "B" on 20 June 1966, in direct support of 9th Marines.

Reliable communications were maintained during the month of June to support tactical requirements.

Message Center and Radio Central were merged to facilitate and expedite handling of message traffic.

MEDICAL AND DENTAL

The Battalion Sick Call for the month of June was somewhat lower than that of May. 219 patients were seen. Complaints were various, however they were consistent with previous months. Heat rashes were most common, but not unusual considering the high temperature experienced. These heat rashes are quite a nuisance, but very rarely incapacitate the individual.

Seven Venereal Disease cases were treated this month. Three of the cases were contracted in the local area and four were from out-of-country. Of these cases, two were penicillin resistant, and a subsequent course of Tetracycline was administered with favorable results.

There were 215 civilian Vietnamese seen in the Battalion Aid Station that required the attention of a Medical Officer. Their various complaints were responsive to the prescribed treatment.

The civic action medical teams visited Phong Bac hamlet three times a week during the month. There were 903 patients treated with a total of 1,283 treatments. Visits continued at Hoa Cuong village this month. There were 1,186 patients seen and 1,829 treatments given.

The villages of Phu Hoa, Xom Mit, Cam Hoa and Hoa Cam (Vietnamese dependent housing area) were visited in coordination with the Hoa Cam Training Advisors. There were 1,256 patients seen and 1,891 treatments given.

The total patients seen by the medical teams in all hamlets were 3,560. The total treatments were 5,337.

The 3d Tank Battalion's Civic Action program continued during June 1966 to provide the people of Phong Bac Hamlet and Khue Truong II Hamlet with medical support, educational facilities and materials, economic aid, defense assistance, relief aid, and health and welfare training.

The Battalion expanded its MEDCAP 430% for the month of June. A total of 5,337 treatments were administered to 3,560 persons during June as opposed to 1,300 treatments given to 813 persons during May 1966. With the movement of many infantry battalions to the South and the West a large vacuum of unattended areas was created in west central Hoa Vang District and northeastern Hieu Duc District. To alleviate this problem, the 3d Tank Battalion stretched its MEDCAP coverage to include approximately 50% of Hoa Thinh Village. This huge new area strained the Battalion's resources considerably, but through the efforts of the Battalion Medical Staff and H & S Company a very satisfactory coverage of the area was achieved. This new area, being in fact a virgin territory, accounted for over 50% of all treatments administered during the month. The Battalion continued to serve its two assigned areas-- Phong Bac Hamlet and Khue Truong II Hamlet. The MEDCAP program consumed about 1,600 man hours of work during June.

In the area of health and welfare the Battalion continues to hold classes and train rural health workers in Phong Bac and Khue Truong II hamlets. The Battalion now has 6 girls ages 13-17 undergoing training in health work. The girls are taught basic health and sanitation, illness diagnosis, minor medical treatment and some preventive medicine. They are all volunteers and work very hard to learn all they can about sanitation, first aid, and as many as they can of the medical skills of the U. S. Navy Corpsman. For if and when the Marine units are removed from this area it will be necessary to leave someone behind with medical experience. This is in keeping with the 3d Tank Battalion long range views of Civic Action. The nurses now under training should be capable of handling all minor ailments that come up on a day-to-day basis and in case of more serious illness or injury they will be cognizant of the correct place to evacuate the person for treatment.

The Battalion acted as coordinator and assistant to the Khue Truong II Hamlet people when they needed to open 250 meters of irrigation ditch located inside the DaNang Air Base defensive perimeter wire. Through direct liaison between the 3d Tank Battalion Commanding Officer and the Air Base Defense Battalion Commander it was decided that the people could come inside the wire to work, but only if they were escorted and guarded at all times. The 3d Tank Battalion provided one truck M-54 to transport the people from their hamlet via the highway to the irrigation ditch location. The Battalion also provided one interpreter and 4 Marines as guards/helpers for the people working on the project. The work took 5 days and was done completely by hand. In addition to the irrigation ditch two springs were reopened at the west end of the ditch. The project is providing water

for 75 acres of rich rice land. Ordinarily, this land would be dry during June, July and August due to the small amount of rainfall in the area. This project was essential for the welfare of over 50 families. The Battalion received thanks from both the Buddhist leader of the area and the Hamlet Chief of Khue Truong II. It was very evident at the time the thanks was given that the Battalion had accomplished much more than just the opening of an irrigation ditch. Again the intangible benefits of getting down in the dirt and helping the people at least equalled the physical accomplishment.

The Battalion initiated its Operation New Life during June 1966. This project designed to give new hope to those stricken with hairlips, cleft palates and other head deformities. The operation began when the Battalion evacuated a 9 year old boy to the USOM hospital near the end of May. On June 10 the stitches were removed from the boy's lip and final healing began. In another week the boy was as normal in appearance as his friends. With this young man as a living testimonial to the success of the corrective surgery it was not difficult to convince others suffering the same disability to enter the USOM hospital in DaNang. A total of three operations have been performed with amazing results. After convincing the parents of the desirability of the operation and arranging with the hospital, the Battalion provides transportation to and from the hospital for the child and one parent. In addition the Battalion provides a small sum of money to purchase food for the child and one parent for as long as he or she must remain at the hospital. This program has truly given new life to these three children. A hairlip is a stigma which young children cannot overlook. A child's whole personality is changed by the ostracism, embarrassment, and disability in speech. With a whole face and unhampered speech he is immediately welcomed back into the "gang" and finds himself all over again. This is exactly what has happened in all three of the cases. This program like so many others has won innumerable friends for the American Marines.

The 3d Tank Battalion continues to provide security for Phong Bac Hamlet, the hamlet school, and the Hoa Tho Village office. This security consists of a squad of Marines which is placed at the Village office and schoolhouse each night. From this squad a fireteam has responsibility for patrolling the entire hamlet during the critical hours of the night. The reward for this defense of the hamlet has been very simply twofold: (1) Not one Viet Cong initiated incident has been reported in the hamlet in almost three months. (2) The people of the hamlet show complete trust and friendliness toward the Marines of the 3d Tank Battalion on all occasions. Gone are the days when more than half the people were afraid to talk to Marines for fear of the repercussions. The people not only talk but volunteer any information they may have concerning Viet Cong activities in the area. Though it is admitted that there are probably still families in the hamlet who sympathize with the Viet Cong, since some of their sons and relatives are operating elsewhere with the VC, the hamlet is so secure

from the VC military and assassination threats that these people have no choice but to go along with the government and loyal people each day. Over an extended period of time these sympathizers will almost certainly join the government, since they must recognize the fact that the government is helping them and protecting them. It is felt that this security which the Battalion has provided has increased the efficacy of the GVN officials as well as the Civic Action Program.

Upon assuming responsibility for the Khue Truong II Hamlet the Battalion began to canvas the hamlet to determine the needs of the people. It was immediately apparent that the biggest need was for educational facilities. The Hamlet possessed a good two room school which wasn't being used because of the total lack of furniture. The school was two years old and had never been used. The Battalion began work immediately to open the school. Construction was begun on benches and desks. A flagpole was constructed outside the school. A blackboard was installed in each of the rooms and a large scale map affixed to the rear wall of each room. The Battalion provided cement and the people patched up bullet holes and worn spots in the walls and decks. The Battalion approached the Village Chief of Hoa Cuong Village concerning teachers. The Chief was able to procure two accredited teachers from Province. It is expected that the school will be opened early in July.

The Battalion continued to work on its two major construction projects located in Phong Bac Hamlet. The Village market place for Hoa Tho Village received 6 pads of cement 12' X 15' X 2". These pads were hand mixed by Marines and Villagers because a cement mixer was not available. The Market Place will accommodate ten shops and have a 30' X 60' central produce trading area. Under the regulations agreed upon by the Village Chief and the District Chief certain standards of cleanliness and decor must be maintained. The second project, (the additional school room for Phong Bac School) is being delayed because of lack of materials. As soon as the material becomes available the additional room will be constructed with labor already allotted by the Village Chief of Hoa Tho Village. This additional room will accommodate 150 children in two shifts a day. The Battalion will also furnish desks for this school room.

During June the Battalion provided the following relief assistance to the people of Phong Bac and Khue Truong II.
